The Worship of God or Mammon (Money)



Some say that it is money & riches that make the world go round. Wealth & money, in themselves, are morally neutral. They are simply a means to an end: an instrument for good or evil. They are never to be honoured, celebrated or worshipped except

They are never to be honoured, celebrated or worshipped except in the good they can achieve & the benefits they bring. They can be the source & cause of greed & avarice or bring immense benefits alleviating poverty, misery & hardship.

An attachment to, or obsession with, money demeans the dignity of the human person. It distorts the image of the Creator-God imprinted upon the human soul: a God of mercy, generosity & lavish kindness to His creatures. It can mask a deep insecurity of what money cannot buy nor riches obtain: enduring peace of soul. Lavish & ostentatious displays of wealth are also an insult to the Lord when so many of the world's people suffer poverty, hunger & deprivation, even lacking the most basic & necessary goods for living. We are reminded of this by the Prophet Amos in this Sunday's first reading at Mass.

"Idolatry not only refers to false pagan worship. It remains a constant temptation to faith. Idolatry consists in divinizing what is not God. Man commits idolatry whenever he honours & reveres a creature in place of God, whether this be gods or demons (e.g. Satanism), power, pleasure, race, ancestors, the state, money,etc). Jesus says, "You cannot serve God & mammon". Many Martyrs died for not adoring "the Beast" refusing even to simulate such worship"
